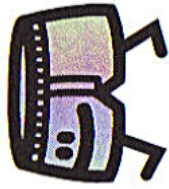


Sage is still on the search!

King County Search Dog Sage and her Fall City handler Stacie Chandler are still going strong! They have been deployed on numerous searches since the last time we checked in, including wilderness, avalanche, water and cadaver. Stacie and Sage ended 2003 with another live find in November when Sage found a missing 48 year old autistic male who had wandered from his home in Shoreline in the early morning hours. He was 320 lbs and combative, but that didn't stop Sage! To start out 2004, Sage located the remains of a Woodmont man who had been missing for 7 years. In April, Sage and Stacie were called out to help with a water search on the Green River where they located a drowning victim missing since February. In August they were called out to help with yet another water search and successfully located that victim as well. Although Sage prefers her live finds, she knows how important it is to provide closure to the loved ones left behind in cases where death has occurred.

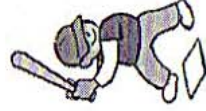
Student Advocacy For Everychild (SAFE)
